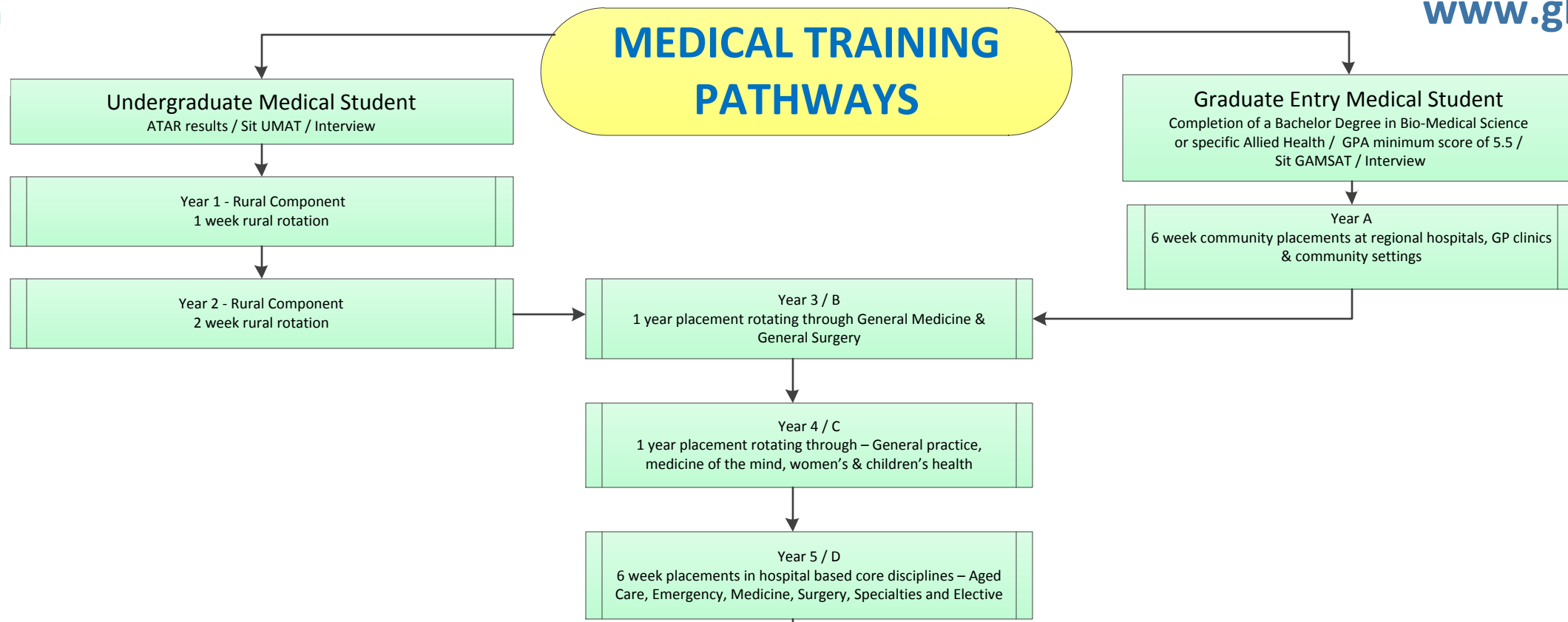

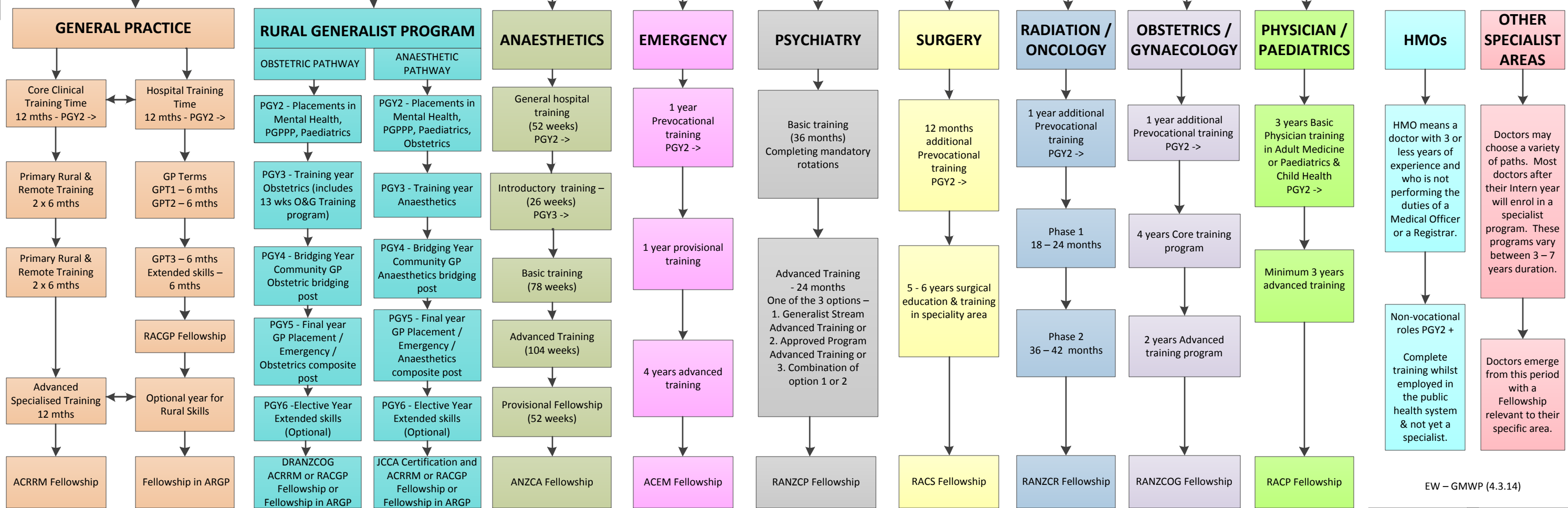


Intern Year - PGY1
MBBS graduates are required to undertake an Intern placement for 12 months to gain registration with the MBA. This must include core & non-core rotations with hospitals & clinics.

GRIT INTERN - The GRIT Intern placement is 12 months in a rural setting across rural hospitals and community clinics for core & non-core rotations.

PGPPP - This provides junior doctors with the option of a rotation in a rural general practice completing 10 or 12 week placements.

DEFINITIONS
